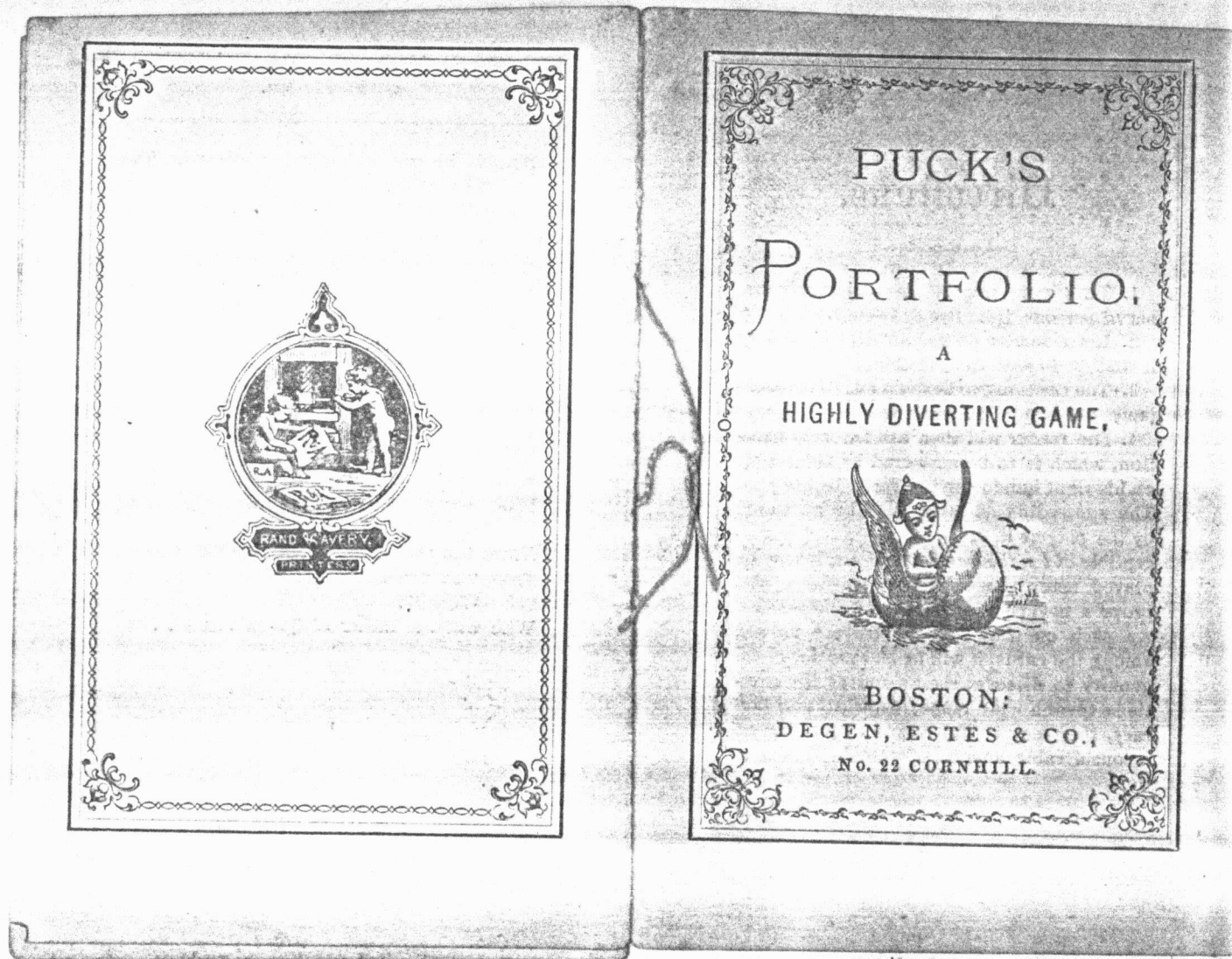

Directions.

1. THIS game may be played by any number of persons, from two to twenty.

2. Let a reader be appointed, whose duty it shall be to read the questions.

3. The cards are to be dealt out to the company, one by one, till none remain.

4. The reader will then ask the first question, which is to be answered by the player on his right hand from the cards before him. The succeeding questions will be answered by the players in turn. As this game is susceptible of *ten thousand* variations, it may be played many times without weariness, and prove a never-failing source of amusement. As each question has its correct answer among the cards, it will be an exercise of ingenuity to discover these; and as the questions cover a wide range, historical and literary, they may be the means of gaining no inconsiderable amount of valuable information.
