# HI! NEIGHBOR

## THE TRADE GAME OF PAN-AMERICAN BINGO

#### FOR ANY NUMBER OF PLAYERS

The purpose of the game is to cover 4 spaces in any row of a trade card (vertically, diagonally or horizontally).

To start the game, a Trader is chosen. His part is to draw the Trade counters one at a time, announce the letter, country and product on each (as "A—Guatemala—Bananas") and then place each counter over its corresponding space on the check sheet (on reverse of these directions).

Up to 20 persons can play Hi! Neighbor. Each player is given one or more Trade Cards and a supply of cover markers, which are to cover on the cards the countries and products called by the Trader.

After the yellow Trade counters are broken apart and thoroughly mixed up in the box top, the Trader starts the game by making the first draw and proceeding as above. Each player then examines his Trade Card (or cards) to see if the country AND product appear under the proper letter of T-R-A-D-E. Only if BOTH country and product are in the SAME space in the PROPER column is the space covered.

This is repeated until some player has covered a full row of spaces on one of the Trade Cards. The row may be horizontal, vertical or diagonal, and the picture spaces do not have to be covered. As soon as a player fills a row, he calls out "Hi! Neighbor," and the game stops.

The player who called "Hi! Neighbor" then reads the trade letter, the country and product of each of the 4 spaces in his row. If they tally with the check sheet, the player wins. If the player has made an error, the player forfeits his card to the Trader and the game continues until a player calls "Hi! Neighbor" and is shown to be the correct winner.

In case two or more players call "Hi! Neighbor" on the same play, they are cowinners and each is credited with a proportionate share of a win.

After each hand the Trade Cards are shuffled and redistributed, and the Trade counters that are on the check sheet put back with the others for reuse.
