RULES

for PLAYING

RUM-E-GOLF

- OBJECT OF GAME—To play one hand (nine holes) with the lowest possible score (strokes).
- PLAYERS—Two, three or four persons may play with one deck. When four (Foursome) play, scoring may be individual or partners. RUM-E-GOLF is also a very fascinating Solitaire game.
- THE DECK—Comprises 72 cards, of which 49 are Numbered Hole Cards and 23 are Wild Cards with a word designation such as Eagle, etc., and a Score Value as indicated by the numeral 5, 6, 7, etc.
- HOLE CARDS—Are numbered 1 to 9 (like nine-hole Golf Course) and each card has Score Value indicated by the numeral 4, 5, 6 or 7.
- PAR-All Nine Holes have equal Par Value of FOUR (Score of 4).
- BONUS CARDS—All cards with Numeral (Score Value) below Par (4) and including the RECOVERY cards with a score value of 4 (Par).
- PENALTY CARDS—All cards with a score value of 5 or more (Above Par) and, including 19th HOLE card (explained further on).
- THE DEAL—Players draw one card from deck. Lowest card determines dealer. Deal for first nine holes of play rotates to left of dealer. Deal for second nine holes of play rotates to right of dealer. After shuffling NINE CARDS ARE DEALT TO EACH PLAYER, face down. Place remaining cards (undealt deck) center of table, face down.
- SCORING—Individual Play: Lowest total score for nine holes wins. Partners:

 Lowest total combined scores of partners wins. For Golfers: Play as above (Medal Play) or, counting holes won (Match Play) or, Scotch Foursomes.
- 19th HOLE CARD—When this card is dealt to a player, or, drawn from UNDEALT DECK it must be immediately exposed before player, on table. Player then draws another card from UNDEALT DECK to fill hand. 19th HOLE has a PENALTY SCORE of FIVE (5). Any Player can dispose of it to next player, whenever able to play a HOLE-IN-ONE, an EAGLE, a BIRDIE or a RECOVERY card on any one of the remaining holes. PLAYER IN POSSESSION OF 19th HOLE CARD AT END OF NINE-HOLE GAME ADDS PENALTY SCORE OF FIVE (5) TO TOTAL SCORE FOR NINE HOLES.
- THE PLAY-Play commences with player to left of dealer on first nine holes and to the right of dealer on second nine holes.
 - (1) Player draws top card from Undealt Deck and places in hand.
 - (2) Player exposes (on table) LOWEST score card for HOLE ONE, playing either a HOLE CARD, a BONUS CARD or a PENALTY CARD.
 - (3) Player then discards one card from hand which is placed FACE UP alongside UNDEALT DECK.
 - (4) If player is unable to play a HOLE card, a BONUS card, or a PENALTY card (this is very rare) player must, first, place a card FACE DOWN in EXPOSED HAND, then, discard one card on EXPOSED CARDS alongside UNDEALT DECK. Player takes a PENALTY SCORE of (11) on FACE DOWN cards.
- CONTINUE PLAY—Next player follows same procedure with only TWO exceptions:
 - (1) AFTER FIRST PLAYER HAS DISCARDED (EXPOSED CARD) NEXT PLAYER HAS PRIVILEGE OF DRAWING FROM UNDEALT DECK or DRAWING PREVIOUS PLAYER'S DISCARD.
 - (2) WHENEVER A PLAYER DISCARDS A CARD ON ANY HOLE THAT IS IN PLAY THE NEXT PLAYER MUST TAKE THAT CARD AND PLAY IT FOR THAT HOLE. ON SUCH A PLAY, PLAYER CANNOT DRAW A CARD FROM UNDEALT DECK.
- NEXT PLAY—After all players have played the FIRST hole, play continues for each succeeding hole the same way. THE PLAY ON EACH HOLE IS FINAL. Example: After first hole has been completed, any card drawn for that hole, later on, cannot be played, even though it might improve player's score.
- THE GAME—LENGTH OF GAME is determined by the players. A FULL GAME is EIGHTEEN HOLES. A HALF GAME is NINE HOLES. Players can continue as many GAMES as desired. SCORING can either be determined by HALF GAMES or FULL GAMES.
