This is a very funny and amusing game, creating laughter, &c. It is very simple, and yet it makes more merriment than a game that requires so much studying before it can be played. Played by any number of players. Entirely new in all its features.

The player that has to play the game should first learn the initial letter of the first name on each of the cards, which is very simple. Washington 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10
 It is so arranged that each of the cards has the same initials on the top of the card, and the initials on the bottom of the card only differ from the first word of text—Work, Play, &c. Simply learn to call to mind the initials on the cards. To play this game the yellow cards, hold the cards face (names) down, and ask some one to select one. As the card is drawn, read the initials, if possible, at the same time. Pretend that you don't care to see it—but you know where the party is reading the names, and remember the number. Suppose the card shows the card "In Love be True;"—i is the 5th letter in Washington;—now ask the same party to find the same name amongst the pink cards. Let him select the card having the name he chose upon it. Then ask him to read the names slowly aloud, and the 5th name will be the one thought of. Let the names all be read before giving your answer. So on with any of the cards. If No. 7 card, "Of Smiles Beware" is selected, it will be always the 7th name on the pink card on which the name thought of is found.

To mystify the company you can have the yellow cards arranged so that the first on top will be No. 1, 2, 3, &c., before entering the room; then commence to deal, one at a time, commencing in the corner. Then give pink cards to No. 3, or No. 4; of course the name will be third or fourth. You might let No. 4 read the names for No. 3—the third name is the right one—or you let No. 1 take the whole pack, and select and keep the one; pass the remainder to No. 2, and so on. Or by means of a blank card let No. 1 mark a list of all the names on the card; then pass whole pack to No. 2. Then have first player read all the names on the one card. This is the best way to play this game.
