
Parlor Croquet



- 1—This game may be played by 2, 3 or more player or by pareners.
- 2—Set up the posts and arches, as shown in the diagram.
- 3—The object of the game is to drive the ball through all the arches and hit the two posts as indicated by dotted lines on the diagram.
- 4—The game is opened by the player holding the ball corresponding with the top color on the posts, and the other players follow according to their order of the colors on the posts.
- 5—The ball is placed on a spot about 5 or 6 inches from the starting post. The player must strike and not push the ball, with the face of the mallet and never with the side of the mallet head.
- 6—Whenever the mallet touches the ball, it must be considered a stroke.
- 7—Player tries to pass the ball through the arches and continues doing so until he misses.
- 8—For each arch through which the player drives his ball, he earns another stroke or turn. If he makes two successive arches with one stroke, he is entitled to two turns or strokes. A player is also entitled to an extra stroke, if his ball hits the ball of an opponent, or, if he hits the turning post when his ball is due at that point.
- 9—The player first succeeding in passing his ball through all the arches, and hitting the starting post, WINS.

MINIATURE GOLF CROQUET

Set the arches to resemble a miniature golf course, and try to drive the ball through each arch. The one who drives the ball through each arch in the least amount of strikes is declared the Winner.
