A Trip through America.

Bob and his sister Betty love reading stories of adventures in the far-off land of America. They cannot tear themselves away from their books when they are just in the middle of a desperate battle with Indians, or some other exciting encounter.

In secret they decide to pay a visit to this fascinating country, in order to have some adventures themselves, and in this game we will accompany these enterprising children on their journey.

To the game belong a board, 6 pieces, and dice.

The eldest player begins:

- No. 1. Bob and Betty hide themselves as stowaways on board a liner leaving for New York, and as they are not discovered until the ship is at sea, the captain has to take them with him.
- No. 1 has to be thrown by each player. No. 6. When entering New York harbour they gaze with astonishment at the gigantic statue of Liberty, and at the sky-scrapers in the background. They had never imagined that houses could be so large. The player must miss two turns, as he has wasted too much time in looking at the marvels of this, the greatest of American cities. Now they go on quickly to Washington, the capital of the United States, in order to see the famous President, the "White House", and the Seat of Congress, and then further in the luxurious express to the banks of the Mississippi, the longest river in the world. After they have gazed in wonder at the gigantic slaughter houses in Chicago they decide to wander through the prairies, and see the famous herds of cattle.
- No. 10. They leave the train and moveon to No. 17.
- No. 13. Two cowboys in pursuit of escaping cattle ride by at full galop (sic). The player os frightened, and goes back to No. 8.
- No. 20. Now on to Mexico by motor.

The player moves on to NO. 24.

No. 32. A visit to the Indians, who inhabit a large part of the country. They dance their war-dance before the children, and are most hospitable. In consequence of his long stay the player must go back to No. 27.

No. 36. Again on their travels, this time by aeroplane across Central America direct to Brazil, the largest country of South America.

The player pays for the journey 5 counters into the pool. No. 40. After a stay in the capital, Rio de Janeiro, they visit virgin forests,

the tropical wonders of which are well-known.

Invited by a farmer to a long stay the player receives one counter from each of the others. Just a short visit to the Argentine, the second largest country of South America, and to the other

No. 46. states and now comes the return journey from Buenos Aires. This number must be thrown by each player.

The player who first reaches or goes beyond No. 50 is the winner, and receives 2/3 of the pool. The next in order takes the rest.
