

The Merry Game of Old Bachelor.

48 CARDS.

ANY NUMBER OF PERSONS CAN PLAY.

DIRECTIONS.—Deal out all the cards, one at a time, face downward, beginning on the left of the dealer. The object is to match the cards and play them in pairs.

The one on the left of the dealer begins by laying down any two of his cards that match, or are alike. If he has no cards that match, he draws a card from his right-hand neighbor. If this enables him to match any of his cards, he plays the match.

But, whether he can match or not, after drawing, it is then the next left-hand player's turn to match and play. Upon each turn a player can play as many matches as he may have, or the game may be limited to his playing a single match; and after drawing one card, the turn always passes to the next player.

This goes on until all the cards are matched except the Old Bachelor Card. The holder of this at the end of the game is the
