

The Long Green Milton Bradley 1936

Playing Implements:

Four horses, one each of four colors ( red, blue, yellow, & green)

THE WAY TO PLAY

Players roll the dice, high roll having the first play.

Each player selects a horse, and the 24 markers of same color as his horse; and \$1200 in various denominations.

The first player rolls the dice for his play, moving his colored horse from the "Start", the number of spaces indicated by the dice..... He follows the buff and blue colored track, and pays into the Bank ( center of Board) the amount shown in the space on which he stops.

When a player lands on a space bearing the name of a horse, he may buy that horse or wait until he comes to another space with a horse's name, and buy that.

To win the race a player must own a horse represented by one of the names on the board and also a sweepstakes ticket.

BUYING A HORSE:

A player pays into the Bank the amount shown after the horse's name, and places a marker of his own color on the space to indicate his ownership...No player may own or run more than one horse in a race.

BUYING SWEEPSTAKES TICKETS:

A player stopping in a space reading "SWEEPSTAKES TICKET" must buy the ticket, paying \$5 to the Bank and placing one of his markers on the space to denote ownership.

When a horse has run all the way around the track, and reaches the space marked "RUNWAY ENTRANCE" he moves inward onto the Red track, and starts his spurt for the Finish line..... He must, however, land on the Runway Entrance by an exact throw of the dice. If he is two spaces from the Finish Line, for example, he must throw a two to land him on the Line, and does not move until this number is thrown unless, of course, he throws a "1" which lands him one space nearer the Finish.

THE PURSE:

The first horse to cross the Finish Line wins the game and its player takes all the "money" which has been placed in the Bank in center of the board; ; ; ; or

To add zest to the game, a purse may be decided upon at opening of the game, each player contributing an equal amount, and the winner taking this in addition to the fund in the Bank.
