Consists of a set of cards on which are printed interesting and attractive designs with holes punched throughout the card. (See illustrations on following pages.) With each set of material is furnished an ample supply of disks or dots called MAGIC "DOTS," which are of proper size to fit snugly into the holes in the cards when placed therein by the fingers of the child, yet these "Dots" can be readily removed when desired and used over and over again. They are enameled with eight bright colors and when placed in the cards make very pleasing and attractive pictures.

By changing the position of the "MAGIC DOTS" an endless variety of effects can be produced.
