SIMPLE SIMON

This game comprises seven sets of cards each, consisting of pictures of the story of Simple Simon. Each set has three pictures alike, numbered 1, 2, 3.

The object is to form sets by calling for cards from other players. Shuffle the cards and deal one at a timme, face down, to aech player. The player at the left of the dealer then begins the game by asking the dealer for any card he may wish, giving name and number, as Pieman No. 3 and if successful he may call for and receive other cards from any player until he misses.

The next one at the left may call for any cards he may want, until he misses and so on.

When a player has three cards of a set they are laid on the table. At the end the player having the most sets WINS THE GAME .
