

*Learning to Fly in***THE ARMY AIR CORPS**

FOR 1 TO 5 PLAYERS



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This game is played in three stages corresponding to the three phases of Army Air Corps training: **Primary**, **Basic** and **Advanced**. It is the purpose of each player to complete these three stages in training one after the other by covering with his pieces, according to the rules of the game, all of the spaces in the **Red Section**; then all the spaces in the **White Section** and finally all the spaces in the **Blue Section**.

The indicator determines the play. This indicator has three segments — Red, White and Blue, corresponding to the colors above and below the illustrated spaces around the board. The numbers on the three segments of the dial also correspond to the numbers around the board.

The person, chosen to play first, spins the indicator or pointer in the center of the dial and when the pointer stops on a number the player places one of his own colored markers on the border picture with the corresponding number. If he already has a piece on that space he does not play. The turn then passes around the table to the left.

Play the Red circle first. When a player has placed a marker on all of the border pictures banded in Red, **he next plays the White circle**, reads the **White segment on which the spinner stops and places markers on the border pictures banded in White**. When he has **completed the White panel, he plays the Blue circle** on the dial and arranges his markers in the border pictures banded in Blue.

THE FIRST PLAYER WHO COMPLETES THE ENTIRE BOARD OR PANEL BY PLACING HIS MARKER IN EACH SQUARE WINS THE GAME.

Note: Certain segments instruct the player to add or remove one or more markers. These must be removed from the section of the board or panel which corresponds in color to the circle on the dial where the instructions appear. However, the specified number of markers may be removed from, or added to, any picture in that particularly colored border strip.
