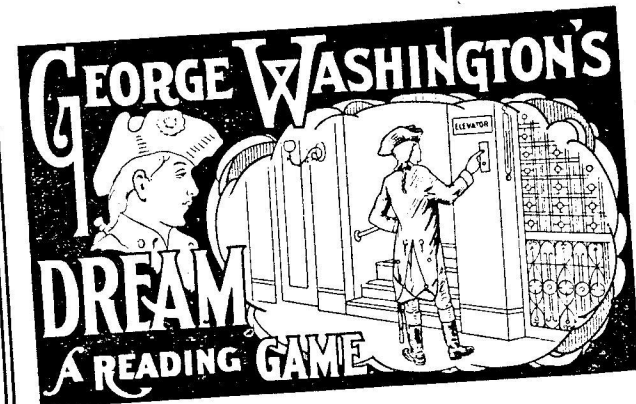

This Game May be Played by Any Number of Players

It is a short story telling of a famous dream that George Washington had and showing his interesting and peculiar experiences as though he were living at the present time. The blank spaces are left to be filled in by the players as the game progresses.

One person is selected to read the story, and he divides the cards among the players, who arrange their cards in a pile, face downward, and do not select or pick them out, but take them off this pile in regular order.

The reader pauses at each — in the story and the players, beginning at the left of the reader, each read their cards in rotation, one for each —, thus filling in the story. After reading a card, lay it aside. As the cards never come twice in the same order, an endless and comical variation in the narrative is secured.
