## THE OLD TESTAMENT GAME OF PROVERBS

Separate the cards into two parts, having all the cards of one color in one pack, and the other color in another pack, and dealing them ALL, one at a time, to each of the players. This is so each player will have an equal number of cards of each color.

The player on the dealer's left begins by reading the quotation on any card containing a number only without the letter "A," not mentioning the number thereon. The next player in turn endeavors to complete the remainder of the quotation, and if so doing gets both the cards. If this player is unable to do so the turn passes to the next, and so on.

If no one knows the remainder of the quotation the dealer will call the number of the card read, and the player having the card with the same number with an "A" reads the quotation and gets the two cards. The player obtaining the largest number of cards at the end of the game WINS.
