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Select the score keeper.

Distribute cards evenly face down on the table. The player left of the score keeper will start the game by turning the first card of his pile up and reading the first question; if player is unable to answer, then the next player in turn will try to give the correct answer.

The player giving correct answer will turn up his top card and proceed to ask the

first question on his card. The other players will follow in same manner.

When every player's first question is asked begin with the second question and continue same until all questions are answered on each player's card. When first cards are finished begin with second cards and etc.

The score keeper is to keep tab of those answering questions correctly. When the game is ended the score keeper will check up and the player that has most questions answered correctly wins the game.

The score keeper may read the correct answers to the questions that could not be answered by the players. From two to seventy-five persons may play this game at one time. When played in school the teacher may be the score keeper.
