

# BILD-A-GRAM

Is a fascinating new game, conceived for the entertainment of adults as well as children. It is highly instructive and amusing, and so designed, that it may be played in many different ways.

## RULES:

All the players are to agree on the selection of the title of a motion-picture and its star—or a state or country and its capitol,—or words or sentences and names of any description, for example:

“GRETA GARBO IN ANNA CHRISTIE” or

“WASHINGTON, D. C., UNITED STATES OF AMERICA” or

“RED, WHITE AND BLUE” or

“GEORGE WASHINGTON WAS THE FIRST PRESIDENT” or

For children simple words such as “CAT”, “DOG”, “RAT”, “BOY”, “HORSE”, “LION”, etc., is suggested.

Each player places a “Bild-A-Gram” board before him. The first player then spins the dial—the letter to which the dial points, is placed on Bild-A-Gram board in its approximately proper position. Should the letter which dial indicates, not appear in title you are building, the play is passed on to the next player, etc. Do not take any letters not appearing in your title. The first player who correctly completes the Bild-A-Gram selected, is the winner.

In each instance, abide by the indication of the dial. Should dial stop at bonuses or penalties, such as “*Remove One*” or “*Take Two*,” dial must rest on the black spot. If dial rests on white spot on either side, the play does not count and passed on to the next player. If dial stops directly on a black line separating letters, the play does not count and same player spins again.

Bild-A-Gram may also be played as follows:

Each player, in spinning the dial, selects the letter indicated, placing it on their Bild-A-Gram board—regardless of whether a Z or Q, or any other letter. The first player completing any standard English word, excepting proper nouns or names and containing 5, 6, or 7 letters, is declared the winner.

The advantage in taking each letter indicated at every spin, whether you may use it or not, is that it may be discarded should dial indicate “*Lose one*,” etc.

Bild-A-Gram may be played by 2, 3 or 4 persons.

There are 512 letters supplied with this game.
