## UNITE STATES GEOGRAPHICAL LOTTO - 1930° THE STATLER MAFG. CO. INC.

This game uses twenty, (20) cards, each card being a section of the map of the U.S. Each section shows twelve (12) cities arranged and distinguished to indicate their relative importance. Two hundred and forty (240) small "Lotto" cards are used. 227 cards with the name of one of the cities on same one card printed upon, and thirteen blanks.

## DIRECTIONS FOR PLAY

Some one person is selected as Conductor of the game. The Conductor "shuffles" and "deals" the cards to the players as in the usual card games. The cards are placed on the table in front of each player, face upward.

The little "Lotto" cards are placed in a box or hat so as not to be seen by the Conductor who then proceeds to take the Lotto cards out one by one. As each card is drawn the Conductor reads aloud

the name printed thereon.

The players look over their cards to see if the city called is on his map sections. If he finds the city on one of his cards, he announces it, and names the state in which the city is located. The Lotto card is then given to him that he may cover the city on his card with the Lotto card having the same name.

The player who first covers all the cities shown on his cards wins

the game. He announces this by calling aloud "Lotto"!

Note1 - Where two or more cities the same mame occur players must use blank cards as covers. The blank cards have as much weight in the game as those printed upon.
