

## HOW TO PLAY "GOLD MEDAL" BINGO

Bingo is an exciting and enjoyable game for young and old. There can be as many players as there are Bingo cards in the set. Each set consists of:

One Banker's chart.

Counters, numbered 1 - 75.

Quantity of Bingo cards, each with five rows of figures each way.

Markers to cover up the called numbers on the Bingo cards.

To start the game a Banker is chosen. The Banker has charge of the Banker's chart and the numbered counters. The Banker's chart is numbered 1 - 75 serially in five vertical rows. The five rows are lettered B I N G O. Row B is numbered 1 to 15 reading down. Row I is numbered 16 to 30, Row N is numbered 31 to 45, Row G is numbered 46 to 60, Row O is numbered 61 to 75.

Each of the other players is given an equal number of Bingo Cards and the markers are also divided equally among them. The Banker shuffles the numbered counters and turns them face down. He then draws them from the pile one at a time. As he draws, he calls out loudly the letter and the number on that counter. For instance, he draws B-12. All players who have number 12 in the B column of any of their Bingo cards cover that number with a marker. Players who do not have this number on any of their cards wait for the next number to be called. The Banker then places the B-12 counter on Number 12 in B row on his Banker's chart.

The Banker draws another numbered counter as soon as all players are ready. He calls it; players who have it on any of their cards cover it, and the Banker himself covers the number on his Banker's chart with the numbered counter he just called. This procedure continues until one player has covered five squares in a row, either vertically, horizontally, or diagonally. The "FREE SPOT" in the center of each Bingo card does not have to be covered. It counts as a covered spot at all times. As soon as one player has covered five squares in a row, either vertically, diagonally or horizontally, that player loudly calls out "Bingo."

The Banker stops calling out numbers. He then checks the Bingo by having the player call out the numbers that go to make his row of five covered squares. As the player calls out his covered squares, the Banker double checks by making sure the numbers called out by the player, are covered by numbered counters on the Banker's chart. Should there be a mistake made by the player which shows that he does not have Bingo, but misplaced one or two numbers, the Banker removes all the markers from the row just called, from that player's Bingo card as a penalty.

In case of two or more players going Bingo at the same time the winner is decided by drawing lots. The winner of that game becomes the Banker for the next round.

All Bingo cards are shuffled and redistributed and the game proceeds as before.

If there are cards in excess of the number of players, each player may want to take two or more cards and play them at the same time, but independently. These players don't have to go Bingo on all cards, but only on one of their cards to win the game.
