Lotto may be played by any number of persons. Each player draws a numbered disc from the box and the one having the highest number is the leader.

Each player except the leader is then given three of the number charts and a supply of markers.

The numbered discs are left in the box and the game is started by the leader who, without looking, draws a numbered disc from the box calls out the number thus selected. The players immediately cover this number with a marker wherever it appears on their number charts.

The game continues in this manner; that is, by calling numbers and covering the corresponding numbers, until the game is over.

The object of the game is to cover all the numbered spaces in any one row on any chart. The first player to do this calls "Lotto" and wins the game.

Another method of playing is that of requiring a player to cover all the numbered spaces on any one of his cards before winning the game.
