# How to Play . . .

# "take it or leave it!"

The game "Take It or Leave It" has eight subjects, two There are forty-eight questions to each subject, all questions pertaining to a given subject will be on a background of the same color.

To start the game, first select an Umpire or Master of Ceremonies, whom we will refer to as the Umpire. The Umpire takes charge of the \$500.00 bogus money and the book of rules and answers.

After the Umpire has been selected said Umpire starts the game "Take It Or Leave It" by asking the first player which of the eight subjects listed he wants to talk about. After the subject has been selected the Umpire then spins the spinner. There are forty-eight questions to each subject and the question the spinner points to is the first question. If the player answers the question correctly the player has the privilege of taking the \$1.00 or may try for the \$2.00 question; if he again gives the correct answer he may then take the \$2.00 or try for the \$4.00 question; if he answers the \$4.00 question correctly he may then try for the \$8.00 question; if he answers that correctly he may try for the \$16.00 question or take the \$8.00. If player trys for the \$16.00 question and gives the correct answer he may then try for the \$32.00 question; if he gives the correct answer he may then try for the \$64.00 Question. If the question is answered correctly the Umpire gives him \$64.00 and the turn passes to the next player who starts in the same manner with the \$1.00 question.

A player may take his accumulated money at any time until he reaches the \$64.00 question, but if, at any time, said

player fails to give the correct answer the accumulated money is forfeited to the "Jack Pot Fund." All players participate in the "Jack Pot" Question.

The "Jack Pot" is an accumulation of money forfeited by players who could not answer a question correctly. In other words, if a player tries for a sixteen dollar question he cannot answer correctly he loses the \$8.00 he has already accumulated to the "Jack Pot" fund. The "Jack Pot" belongs to all in each corner, each on a background of a different color. the players even though they have won the \$64.00 question money. The Umpire spins the spinner for the Jack Pot Question. The "Jack Pot" questions are found in the inner small circle and has only twenty-four questions. All players participate in the "Jack Pot" Question by writing their answer one minute after the Umpire spins for the question. If one or more player answers the question correctly the money is divided equally. If no one gives the correct answer the fund carries over to the next game.

#### PLEASE DO NOT PROMPT.

The Umpire only refers to the answer given in the rule book when correct answer is in dispute.

If the question is not answered correctly "DO NOT GIVE CORRECT ANSWER," the same question may be repeated in second game and you will be helping others to win with said question in following games.

The number of players are not limited.

The player who has accumulated the most money at the end of the game is declared the winner by the Umpire.

When starting the second game you may select a new Umpire or the same person may continue.

On your last game, if no one has answered the "Jack Pot" Question correctly divide the money equally among all players.
